Humanitarian Reach

337,153 Direct Beneficiaries Reached

56,700 Indirect Beneficiaries Reached



WASH Interventions

- Approximately 126,000 individuals reached through integrated WASH activities
- 2,400 households received soap distributions
- 16,000 households received chlorine distributions
- 350 dignity kits distributed to women and girls
- 7 large-scale hygiene promotion campaigns conducted
- 20 handwashing stations installed
- Hamsh Korib Water Yard rehabilitated and solarized
- Yassin Hospital water pipeline rehabilitated
- 30 hygiene promoters trained
- 10 water committee members trained



Peace-building

- 200,000 people reached
- 25 peace committees established
- 120 dialogue sessions facilitated
- 5,000 youth trained
- 3,500 women engaged in leadership initiatives



Health

- 120,470 people accessed essential healthcare services
- 97,450 outpatient consultations provided
- 57,400 vaccinations supported
- 23,322 nutrition screenings conducted
- 51 healthcare workers trained
- 29 community health volunteers trained



Shelter and NFI

- 1,500 emergency shelter kits distributed
- 1,000 NFI kits distributed
- 950 hygiene kits distributed
- 75 demonstration shelters constructed
- 1,500 households trained on shelter construction and fire prevention

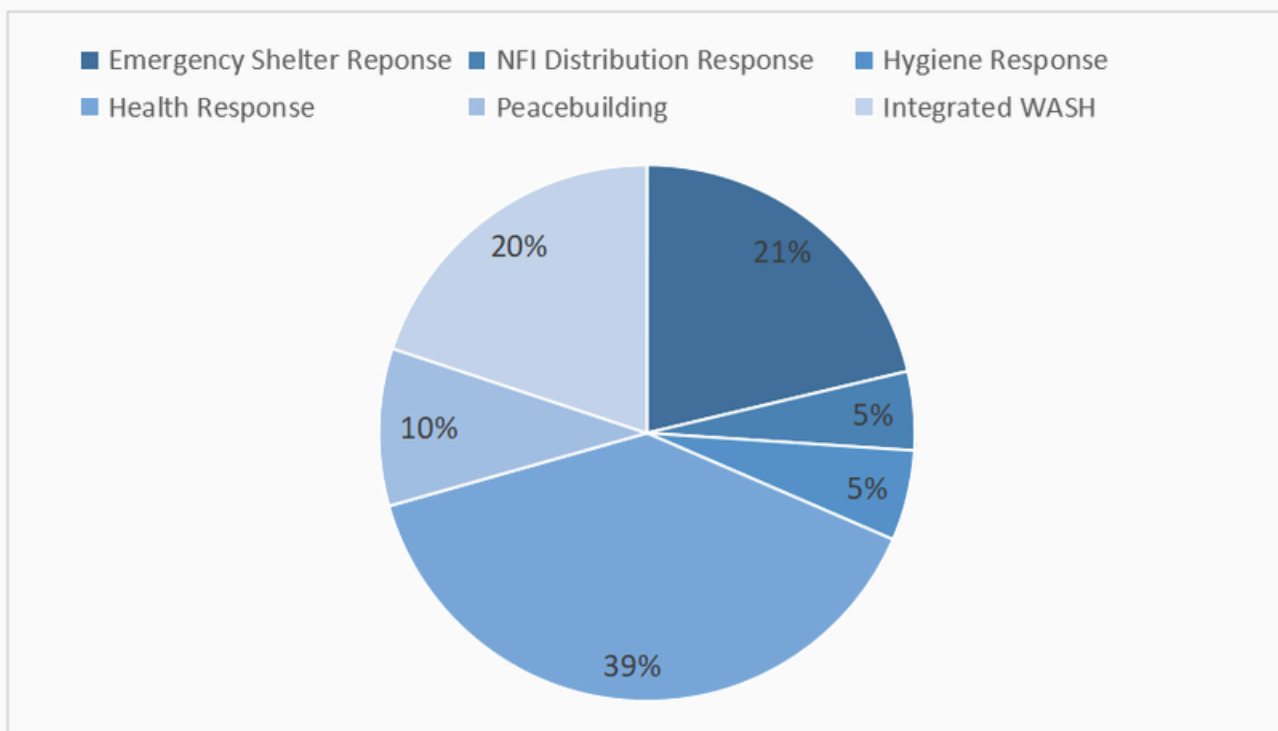

Mobile Services Expand Access

Mobile clinics proved essential for reaching remote and displaced populations.

Capacity Building Enhances Sustainability

Investing in local staff and volunteers strengthens long-term community resilience.

Peacebuilding and Humanitarian Response Are Complementary

Integrating peacebuilding within humanitarian programming improves acceptance and contributes to longer-term stability.

Preparedness Improves Response Speed

Pre-positioning supplies and maintaining contingency stocks allows faster response during emergencies.

ARC aims to further strengthen its humanitarian and resilience programming through:

- Expansion of healthcare services
- Scale-up of shelter and NFI interventions
- Strengthening emergency preparedness systems
- Expansion of WASH programming
- Growth of peacebuilding and social cohesion initiatives
- Enhanced monitoring and accountability systems
- Increased localization and community leadership
- Diversified donor partnerships and resource mobilization
- Improved logistics and warehousing capacity
